HANDICAPS

Just a reminder, The Westlake Handicap System will be on throughout the year. If you play in Virginia or anywhere that considers itself a year round golf course, you are to post that score on the handicap com-

puter. Starting January 1, 2012, your handicap number will not work unless you pay your dues. Once the dues are paid your handicap number will work as normal.

To post a score, you can either give a Westlake Shop Attendant your card (just make sure you put your full name, tees you played from, and the date on the card) or take your card home and post online at www.vsga.org.

Just remember, a handicap is formulated to even out each player by their ability. This means that if you played the best player in the world and you had a legitimate handicap you would be able to give him/her a fair match. Just to give you an example, at the 2010 Men's Westlake Shootout the final two competitors had handicaps from the opposite side of the spectrum. After the shoot out was over I looked at their scorecard and both of them shot the same net score. This proves that with a legitimate handicap you can play with and against anyone.
